Scholars will also apply the Pythagorean Theorem to determine unknown side lengths in right triangles in real-world and mathematical problems in two and three dimensions. Their My Path lessons are an integral part of their study of mathematics. Please make sure they continue passing three lessons each week.

The Nurse's Corner

We are still in the winter months; please continue to dress your child accordingly to avoid any respiratory diseases such as, flue, pneumonia, RSV, and others. Also, if your child show any signs of conjunctivitis (pink eye) please take your child to the doctor.

Conjunctivitis Mode of Transmission:

- Contact with an infected person's skin, body fluid or though contact with a contaminated surface and then touching mucus membranes/eyes.
- Symptoms of Red eyes, usually with some discharge or crusting around eyes; may be itchy, sensitive to light, or watery.
- Bacterial: may have yellow/greenish discharge; may affect one or both eyes. Allergic and chemical conjunctivitis usually affects both eyes.

Incubation Period

Bacterial: Unknown

Viral: Varies with etiology

Period of Communicability Bacterial: From onset of symptoms until after start of antibiotics, or as long as there is discharge form the eye.

Viral: Variable, before symptoms appear and while symptoms are present (Allergic and chemical conjunctivitis is not contagious).

Criteria for Exclusion from School Bacterial, Viral, or unknown etiology: Exclude if conjunctivitis is accompanied by symptoms of systemic illness or if the child is unable to keep hands away from eye.

Childcare rules: exclude if purulent drainage until after 24 hours of treatment


