## **Washington School will:**

  Additionally, a student progress report will be given to parents the 5<sup>th</sup> week of each quarter. These meetings can be held in person or virtually.
- Use the Power School system, which is a live parent portal system to track students' attendance, discipline, and academic data.
- Provide training around technology and accessing student's data. This may include in person training, virtual training or videos created by the staff.
- Provide parents with reasonable access to teaching and support staff as well as encourage parents to use the virtual classrooms (Class Dojo), district e-mail and/or phone system to communicate with staff.
- Encourage parents to volunteer during curriculum-aligned activity nights, field trips and school and district committees.
- Maintain a safe environment that will also include school and bus evacuation drills, severe weather/shelter drills, and law enforcement drills.
- Implement a comprehensive social and emotional learning plan to address the whole child.

#### **Parent Responsibilities**

- Monitoring attendance and tardiness.
- Ensuring that homework is completed by referencing homework folders, guides, packet, or websites.

- Developing a positive home/school partnership with my child's teacher.
